Formonthills

Formonthills is a wonderful community woodland on the lower slopes of the Lomond Hills with spectacular views across the Firth of Forth to Edinburgh and beyond.

Its mosaic of habitats including new and mature woodland, wildflower meadows and wetland is a haven for wildlife. The site supports a rich diversity of wildflowers, insects, birds and mammals including red campion, dragonflies, butterflies, buzzards and roe deer.

Discover the secrets of the wood and its surprising sculptures. Explore its network of paths or take one of the two waymarked trails.



We want everyone to enjoy this special place. Help us by keeping your dog under control and use the bins provided. Your dog is your responsibility.



Take a stroll across the boardwalk. In summer watch the astonishing aerial manoeuvres of dragonflies above the marsh.



Explore the sculptures hidden within the wood. Create your own rhythmical sounds on the slit drums, tell the time using the sundial and take a breather on the carved bench.



Secretive roe deer live here all year round but they're easier to spot in winter. Look for their white rumps moving along woodland edges.
